Hot Men, Cold Dictatorships Premieres in West Hollywood on April 29

Los Angeles, April 2016 – For the West Hollywood audiences SEEFest presents the North American premiere of feature length documentary, *Hot Men, Cold Dictatorships* by Mária Takács from Hungary, about what it meant to be a gay man before the political “transition” in Hungary and Eastern Europe. This is the first film produced in the former Eastern bloc that deals with the generations of older and younger gay men, and first to investigate their life stories with the help of secret service files of the previous political regime. This special presentation will take place on Friday, April 29, at 7PM at the West Hollywood Council Chambers, 625 N San Vicente.
